Frequently cited in discussions of the ‘consent’ theory of power. The accuracy of this ‘Gandhian paradigm’ of Boetie has been questioned (see Randle, [Civil Resistance](#) [2] (A. 1.b. Strategic Theory, Dynamics, Methods and Movements) [3] , p. 31), but Boetie has been used in the past by religious dissidents and from the 20th century by exponents of unarmed resistance.
