Account by former Lieutenant in the US navy of an attempt by four people to sail a ketch into the US nuclear testing zone at Eniwetok in protest against the tests. Defying an injunction, the ketch sailed 5 miles into the zone before being stopped by US navy. Their example inspired a second attempt by Earle and Barbara Reynolds (see Reynolds, [The Forbidden Voyage](#) [2] ([D.3.c. Studies of Particular Countries, Campaigns or Actions](#) [3])).
