

Raising My Voice: Story of the Afghan Woman Who Spoke Out

Explores life of young woman who secretly ran schools for girls in Herat during Taliban rule, was elected to the Afghan parliament in 2005 at the age of 23, but was thrown out of it for raising women's issues, and who had by 2009 already survived five assassination attempts.
