

## Feminism is African, and other implications of reading Oyèrónké Oy?wùmí as a relational thinker

The author interprets the work of Nigerian feminist scholar Oyèrónké Oy?wùmí to be embedded in a relational understanding of subjectivity, as developed in African philosophy, that is deeply relational, fluid and nondichotomous and therefore not reducible to the strict, essentialised, hierarchical and stable gender dyad of the colonial Western gender system.
