

Stellan Vinthagen

PhD, born 1964, Senior lecturer and peace and development worker. Stellan is doing research on nonviolent resistance, globalisation and social movements at the School of Global Studies' Department of Peace and Development Research, Göteborg University, Sweden (www.globe.gu.se). His PhD (2005) is exploring the sociology of nonviolent action. Stellan is the author of two books, a co-author of two books and has written several journal articles and papers at conferences. He is co-founder of the Resistance Studies Network (www.padrigu.gu.se/rsn/default.html), a member of the peace and development scholar network of Transcend (www.transcend.org), the Nonviolence Commission of the International Peace Research Association (<http://www.ipraweb.org/>), an associate of the Transnational Foundation for Peace and Future Research (www.transnational.org), a Council member of War Resisters' International (www.wri-irg.org). He is also since over two decades a movement activist and teacher in conflict transformation and civil disobedience. His latest imprisonment for peace work was in England, because of a nonviolent direct disarmament action against the nuclear submarine Trident. He works with local democratisation as the Vice-Chair of the People's Folk High School in Angered (FiA), the global neighbourhood in which he also lives.
